Following the success of the Balinese dance-inspired painting exhibition by Dennis Ho, Uma Ubud and its sister property COMO Shambhala Estate has transformed into an art space to display wooden sculptures by Mickaël

Obrénovitch. In this exhibition titled Human Roots, the French-born artist uses 200-year-old teak wood from Java for his works which are influenced by the notion of the Indonesian forest as Asia's lungs. Throughout the exhibition, the sculptures are shown at Uma Ubud's pool bar, lobby and Italian-inspired restaurant Uma Cucina, as well as COMO Shambhala Estate's lobby, tea house and Ojas lounge.
